A LEVELS EXPLAINED

A (Advanced) Levels are academic qualifications that focus on traditional study skills. They sit at Level 3 on the National Qualifications Framework - see the 'learning ladder', opposite, which shows how different types of qualifications compare, in terms of the demands they place on learners. To secure a place in Petroc's Academy (for more information see page 24), you'll need seven A grades including two A* grades at GCSE.

A Levels normally take two years to complete, full time. They are split into the AS (Advanced Subsidiary – a qualification in its own right) and A2, which each make up 50% of the overall A Level grade.

Most students choose four subjects to study in their first year, then concentrate on three subjects in their second year, achieving three A Levels and an AS Level. But you can take as many as five A Levels, if you're up to the challenge.

At Petroc, we recommend that you have achieved at least five GCSEs at grade C or above to embark on an A Level programme.

Grades

A Level results are graded A* - E. The results are announced in August and March.

UCAS points

If you're applying to university or college for a Higher Education course, A and AS Levels earn the following points in the 'UCAS Tariff':

YOUR GUIDE TO GETTING INTO THE BEST UNIVERSITIES

It pays to think ahead – especially if you want your degree to come from one of Britain's top universities, like Oxford, Cambridge or Warwick.

The choices you make now will affect your chances of success and Petroc offers a range of A Level courses, with a focus on the core subjects our students need to prepare them for university.

High grades are essential but the right choices and combinations of subjects are just as important, so we've spoken to Britain's leading universities to find out what they are looking for in potential undergraduates.

WHICH A LEVEL SUBJECTS SHOULD I CHOOSE?

Universities broadly group their degree courses into two groups: Arts (including Humanities and Social Sciences) and Sciences (including Mathematics).

If you don't know which route you want to take, choose a combination of AS and A2 subjects that keep your options open. We offer the nine A Levels considered core subjects by top universities:

- English**
- Mathematics**
- Further Mathematics**
- History**
- French, German and/or Spanish**
- Geography**
- Chemistry**
- Physics**
- Biology**

We also offer a number of other A and AS Level subjects – some of which are essential for specialist courses or may be useful to your future career.

As well as choosing subjects that you enjoy and are good at, check university prospectuses and websites to see the subjects they're looking for.

If you're focusing on the arts, sociology, law and classics are just some of the courses you might wish to take alongside the core subjects such as English, history, languages and mathematics.

For the sciences, our biology, chemistry,

physics and maths A Levels are the core, with further mathematics also essential for some degrees. You should choose at least two, or ideally three of these A Level subjects and bear in mind that top universities often expect candidates to have studied four of them.

FIND OUT MORE

University prospectuses and websites give further information on degree courses, entry requirements and recommended A Level choices.

Petroc also offers a range of high quality Foundation Degrees in Barnstaple, through our partnership with Plymouth University.

Following her outstanding A Level results, the former Holsworthy Community College pupil has gone to Sheffield University.


And, before she left North Devon for South Yorkshire, Sabine spoke to us about her time at Petroc.

The former Pilton Community College pupil is now studying Natural Sciences at Cambridge, after gaining four A* grades at A Level in summer 2011.



APPLICATION

You can apply online at **www.petroc.ac.uk** from October 2011* and you'll receive confirmation of your application via e-mail. If you need any help with your application, come in and see us, or call the Guidance Centre on 01271 338125. We always encourage students to apply by the end of January, to guarantee places on the courses you want but if you haven't made a final decision by then, you can apply at a later date.

INTERVIEW

Soon after we confirm your application, we'll send you a letter inviting you to interview. It's nothing to worry about; just a chance for us to get to know more about you and your learning needs, and a chance for you to find out more about life at Petroc and your chosen course.

If you can't make the date or time we ask you to come in for your interview, let us know and we'll arrange a more convenient appointment.

OFFER

Following your interview, you will receive a letter offering you a place at Petroc. It'll specify any agreed conditions, such as the exam grades you need and the subjects required (eg five GCSEs at grade C or above, including English and Maths, for most A Level courses.)

*Paper copies of our application form are available if you don't have internet access.

UPDATES

Once you've accepted your offer of a place at college, we'll send you regular updates and reminders, by e-mail and in the post; from book lists and summer homework (for some subjects) to newsletters and details of your induction days. SUPPORTING YOUR STUDIES

CAREERS

During your time at Petroc, we will encourage you to think about your future. Your tutor will hold regular one to one reviews with you to help you produce an Individual Action Plan. Our Guidance Centre has a very large stock of books, prospectuses and computer-based materials to help you plan your next steps. There is also a comprehensive programme of visiting speakers and careers events. Petroc works closely with Careers South West and personal advisors are available for one to one interviews.

FINANCIAL HELP

If you need help with money to pay for things like specialist equipment or childcare, we may be able to help, via the Bursary Fund or Adult Learner Support Fund. Further details are available from the Guidance Centre.

TRANSPORT

Travel to and from Petroc is provided by Devon Local Education Authority (LEA), as long as you live within our designated area, attend college full time, are aged under 19 and live more than three miles from our main campus.

If you live in the catchment area of Ilfracombe or Bideford Colleges and want to study A Levels with us, you may not be entitled to LEA support but we can arrange transport for you. Please consider all your options before purchasing a bus pass; the most cost effective method may be purchasing your bus pass directly

from the bus company, see the College website for details. You may be entitled to assistance with your transport costs from the Adult Learner Support Fund.

ACCOMMODATION

If you live too far from Petroc to travel home every day, we can help you find accommodation. Our Guidance Centre will refer you to our Student Support Team who can go through your requirements with you, and may be able to help secure appropriate housing.

As a student, you may be able to get help from the Government, in the form of Housing Benefit. Much will depend on your age and circumstances. Our support team can advise you.

CHILDCARE

The Government runs a childcare support scheme for students under the age of 19, called 'Care to Learn', which is designed to allow young learners with children the opportunity to continue their studies.
