In September 2022, we were proud to unveil some amazing new facilities at Petroc Tiverton.

A new reception area now encompasses a large social space with a Costa area and plenty of relaxing seating.

The Digital Learning & Social Hub includes a high-tech virtual reality/augmented reality suite as well as learning pods, a library and areas for communal working.



The Futures Hub building is home to our brand new Business Suite with a modern communal learning space, updated classrooms and computer suites, as well as the Clinical Simulation Suite which provides true-to-life clinical environments where students can practise hands-on clinical skills. It also houses our new Fitness Centre which is open to students as well as the general public. The Centre is bursting with top-of-the-range equipment, a new studio space, a functional training room with rubber floors and new rigs, and fresh new changing rooms and showers.

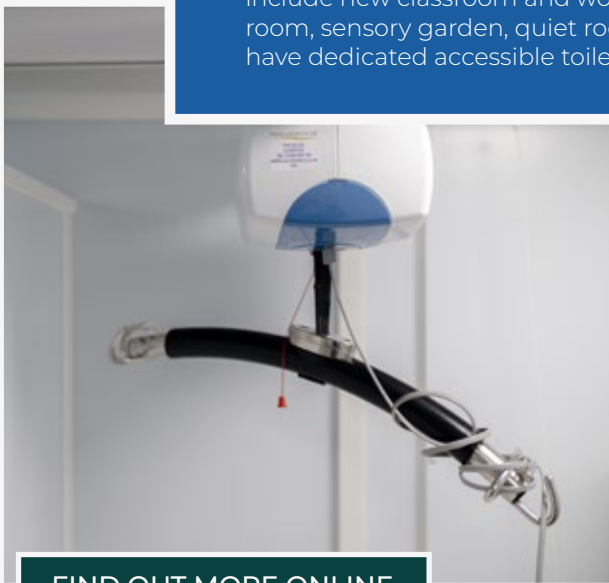




Our Construction Hub incorporates industry-standard carpentry workshops and bricklaying and plastering stations full of high-spec tools for students studying on our construction industry subjects.



We are also currently creating a new Learner Success Hub which will be a dedicated space for learners with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND). It will include new classroom and workshop spaces, a teaching kitchen and cafe, a therapy room, sensory garden, quiet rooms and independent living environments. QUALIFICATIONS AND LEVELS - MAKING THE RIGHT DECISION

There are a number of different qualifications available to you at Petroc. We're here to help you choose the route that is most suitable for your needs and future aspirations.

Our dedicated Advice & Guidance Team can talk you through the options available to you or you can find a detailed explanation of qualifications and levels at petroc.ac.uk/which-course.

Entry Level:

Entry Level courses give you access to Level 1 qualifications and employment. Qualifications include personalised outcomes to enable you to progress.

Entry requirements:

For all learners joining Entry Level Study Programmes, there are no formal entry requirements, however, you will have a one-to-one interview to discuss your personal learning needs. You will also be required to study English and Maths at an appropriate level to suit your ability.

Level 1:

Level 1 courses offer you the opportunity to acquire a broad range of knowledge and practical skills not taught in school to allow you to enter a trade or profession, such as plumbing and construction.

Completing a Level 1 qualification will give you access to Level 2 opportunities, apprenticeships and employment. This includes vocational qualifications and Functional Skills.

Entry requirements:

You must hold **four GCSEs at Grade 2 or equivalent (or above)**, preferably including Maths and English.

If you do not have a GCSE Grade 4 in Maths and/or English, you'll continue studying these subjects alongside your chosen course/s.

At the end of the year, you are expected to have completed and achieved all the components of your Level 1 Study Programme and improved your Maths and English skills (where applicable) before progressing on to your next course.

Level 2:

Level 2 qualifications will start to provide further focus on a subject that can support the transition to a Level 3 industry-relevant T Level, as well as other Level 3 qualifications, apprenticeships and employment.

Qualifications include GCSEs, vocational qualifications and apprenticeships.

Entry requirements:

All entrants must hold **four GCSEs at Grade 3 or equivalent (or above)**, preferably including GCSE Maths and English.

If you do not have a GCSE Grade 4 in Maths and/or English you will continue studying these subjects alongside your chosen course/s.

At the end of the year, you are expected to have completed and achieved all the components of your Level 2 Study Programme and improved your Maths and English skills before progressing to your next level course.

Level 3:

Level 3 qualifications will set you on a path to university, higher apprenticeships or meaningful employment.

Qualifications include T Levels, A Levels, vocational qualifications, advanced apprenticeships, and Access to Higher Education Diplomas.

Entry requirements:

To be accepted onto a Level 3 programme, you must hold **at least five GCSEs at Grade 4 or above, including GCSE Maths and English Language.**

Certain subjects will require higher grade profiles - these are outlined in more detail on our website.

LEVELS 4-6 are university-level qualifications:

Level 4:

Foundation degree (Year 1), honours degree (Year 1), higher apprenticeship, degree apprenticeship, HNCs, professional qualifications.

Level 5:

Foundation degree (Year 2), honours degree (Year 2), higher apprenticeship, degree apprenticeship, professional qualifications.

Level 6:

Honours degree (Final Year), degree apprenticeship.

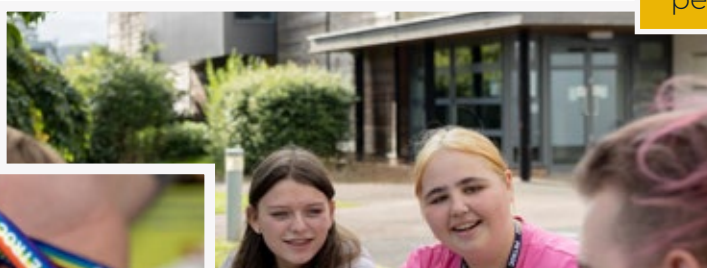

MANAGEMENT & ADMINISTRATION (BUSINESS SUPPORT) T LEVEL

Level 3 | Duration: 2 years

📍 Tiverton | FTT274

Full-time

T Levels ensure you meet the needs of industry by combining classroom theory, practical learning and industry placement.

This course is designed for anyone that wants to excel in business support.

You will study the following units:

- Business context
- Quality compliance
- Change management

You will also have the opportunity to study one occupational specialism from the following:

- Team leadership/management
- Business support

You will also undertake a 315-hour (minimum) industry placement.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

To be accepted onto this programme, you must hold at least five GCSEs at grade 4 or above. This must include grade 5 in English.

PROGRESSION

Successful completion of this qualification will open up a huge range of possible careers in a variety of sectors. It will give you an advantage when applying for a job or when progressing to further study.

CERTIFICATE FOR SUPPORTED EMPLOYMENT PRACTITIONERS

Level 3 | Duration: 1 year

📍 Tiverton | PTT251

Part-time

This qualification is for practitioners who work in a supported employment context.

It will provide you with the knowledge, understanding and skills needed to help disabled and disadvantaged people into employment.

You will study the following units:

- The core values of supported employment
- Working with jobseekers to identify and plan for supported employment
- Engaging jobseekers in supported employment
- Engaging employers in supported employment
- In-work support and career development for supported employment
- Job matching and securing supported employment

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

There are no academic requirements, however, it is beneficial to work within the supported employment or supported internship environment.

PROGRESSION

The primary purpose of this qualification is to support continued professional development for supported employment practitioners.

AAT DIPLOMA IN ACCOUNTING

Level 3 | Duration: 1 year

📍 Tiverton | PTT130L

Part-time

The AAT Advanced Diploma in Accounting offers technical training in accounting, providing you with the specialist knowledge and skills required for progressing into a career in accountancy and finance.

It is suitable if you wish to study part-time alongside employment, or if you are already working in finance.

You will study the following units:

- Advanced bookkeeping
- Final accounts preparation
- Management accounting: costing
- Indirect tax
- Ethics for accountants
- Spreadsheets for accounting

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS


Ideally, you will have already completed the Certificate in Accounting Level 2 or equivalent.

PROGRESSION

Completion of this qualification will enable you to progress to the next level of learning, such as the AAT Professional Diploma in Accounting. Alternatively, you could seek employment in roles such as an accounts assistant, an accounts payable clerk, a credit controller, a payroll supervisor, a bookkeeper or a tax assistant.

CMI DIPLOMA IN MANAGEMENT AND LEADERSHIP (BLENDED LEARNING)

Level 5 | Duration: 2 years

 Tiverton | PTT310

Part-time

This qualification is designed for practising middle managers and those aspiring to senior management who want to develop their core management skills such as managing resources, recruitment and information management.

You will study the following modules:

- Operational leadership and management
- Developing, managing and leading individuals and teams
- Managing stakeholder relationships
- Managing projects
- Creating and delivering operational plans
- Managing finance

This course has been created in partnership with Mindful Education which offer a combination of online learning alongside regular lessons on campus.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You must hold at least five GCSEs at grade 4 or above, including GCSE maths and English.

PROGRESSION

Upon successful completion of this course, you will be awarded the CMI's Foundation Chartered Manager (fCMgr status). You will be able to progress to a higher level qualification or apply to become a Chartered Manager.

BUSINESS & MANAGEMENT APPRENTICESHIPS

We offer two apprenticeships relating to business and management: **Team Leader Supervisor (Level 3)** and **Operations/Departmental Manager (Level 5)**.

Apprenticeships blend classroom learning with on-the-job training, meaning you can earn while you learn. You will usually spend four days in the workplace as a paid employee, with one day in the classroom where you will reinforce and further develop your skills and workplace learnings.

During your apprenticeship, you will be expected to undertake a range of predefined knowledge, skills and behaviours which will relate to your chosen business and management programme.

Depending on the level, an apprenticeship lasts between one and two years and can start at various points in the year.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Each apprenticeship will have its own specific entry requirements; you can find out more on our website.

PROGRESSION

An apprenticeship is a great pathway to a rewarding and successful career, or can be a stepping stone to a higher-level programme.

BRICKLAYING, PLASTERING AND CARPENTRY & JOINERY

Level 1 | Duration: 1 year

 Tiverton | FTT293

Full-time

This introductory programme combines classroom theory and practical learning to provide a taster in a range of subject areas. You will learn core knowledge and specific skills that underpins each of these construction specialisms that will allow you to progress onto a higher level of study within your chosen specialism.

You will undertake an assortment of study components including core and specialist modules, a tutorial programme, and the opportunity to improve your GCSE maths and English. The course will also support you in developing your study skills.

You will cover the following modules:

- Introduction to the construction industry
- Introduction to health and safety
- Introduction to brick and block walling
- Introduction to plastering
- Introduction to carpentry and joinery

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You must hold four GCSEs at grade 2 or equivalent (or above), preferably including Maths and English.

PROGRESSION

Upon successful completion of this course, you can progress onto one of our Transition to T Level construction courses or an apprenticeship pathway.

BRICKLAYING

Level 2 | Duration: 1 year

 Tiverton | FTT198

Full-time

This Diploma in Bricklaying qualification seeks to develop the skills already gained at Level 1.

The focus of the course is improving existing skills as well as learning new practical skills and underpinning knowledge, to enable you to embark upon a progression route in college or a career in the construction industry as a bricklayer.

You will study the following units:

- Building methods
- Construction technology
- Working drawings
- Setting out basic masonry structures
- Thin joint masonry
- Timber frame construction
- Solid walling
- Isolated and attached piers
- Cavity walling foundations
- Vernacular cavity walling

You will also learn to develop the business skills needed to become a successful bricklayer.

All aspects of the course will be studied through both classroom-based theory sessions and workshop-based practical sessions.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You must hold four GCSEs at grade 3 or equivalent (or above), preferably including GCSE Maths and English.

PROGRESSION

Upon successful completion of this programme, you will be able to progress onto a Level 3 construction T Level or a construction apprenticeship.

SITE CARPENTRY

Level 2 | Duration: 1 year

 Tiverton | FTT244

Full-time

This programme will help you to develop the knowledge, skills and behaviours needed to practise carpentry on a construction site.

You will study the following units:

- First and second fix
- Structural carcassing
- Carpentry maintenance
- Use of circular saws
- Health and safety

All aspects of the course will be studied through both classroom-based theory sessions and workshop-based practical sessions.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You will need a minimum of four GCSEs at grade 4 or equivalent, including Maths and English. You must have also successfully completed a Level 1 qualification in Carpentry & Joinery.

PROGRESSION

Upon successful completion of this course, you could advance on to an apprenticeship.

SITE CARPENTRY

Level 2 | Duration: 1 year

 Tiverton | PTT126

Part-time

On this Level 2 Site Carpentry Diploma, you will learn to develop and practice the skills required for employment and/or career progression in Site Carpentry.

You will study the following units:

- Carrying out first fix flooring and roofing
- Carrying out first fix frames, partitions and stairs
- Carrying out second fixing operations
- Carrying out carpentry maintenance
- Setting up and operating a circular saw

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You will need a Level 1 carpentry-related qualification or relevant industry experience. A good understanding of maths and English would also be beneficial.

PROGRESSION

On completion of this programme, you will have the confidence to progress to a higher level course or seek employment in the construction industry.

CONSTRUCTION APPRENTICESHIPS

We offer two apprenticeships relating to construction:

Level 2 Carpentry and Joinery (Site Carpentry) and **Level 3 Advanced Carpentry and Joinery (Site Carpentry)**.

Apprenticeships blend classroom learning with on-the-job training, meaning you can earn while you learn. You will usually spend four days in the workplace as a paid employee, with one day in the classroom where you will reinforce and further develop your skills and workplace learnings.

During your apprenticeship, you will be expected to undertake a range of predefined knowledge, skills and behaviours which will relate to your chosen construction programme.

Depending on the level, an apprenticeship lasts between one and two years and can start at various points in the year.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Each apprenticeship will have its own specific entry requirements; you can find out more on our website.

PROGRESSION

An apprenticeship is a great pathway to a rewarding and successful career, or can be a stepping stone to a higher-level programme.

WHAT CAN I EXPECT?

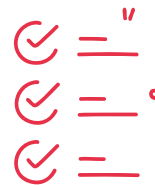
Our foundation learning programmes are aimed at individuals who may be unsure about what career pathway they want to follow.

Throughout your chosen course, our tutors will support and encourage you to develop both your personal and employability skills, building confidence and learning about which career path is right for you. You will be given the opportunity to access a variety of educational visits and group community-based activities, and at the end of your programme, you will be able to attend personalised celebrations of your achievements.

There are no entry requirements for our Foundation Learning programmes; however, you must be willing and able to learn and engage in a variety of vocational and personal development activities.

ENTRY TO CAREER SKILLS

Level 1 | Duration: 1 year

 Tiverton | FTT054

Full-time

This is a supportive programme with small group sizes. It will provide you with an environment to help you develop personal, social and employability skills so that you can progress onto further education opportunities.

You will complete a Level 1 vocational-based qualification alongside English and Maths support. We also support you with developing your confidence and self-esteem and guide you towards your next steps.

Throughout the course, you will be able to develop your personal and social skills through activities embedded within the programme such as half-termly trips and visits and an end-of-year residential trip.

You will also have the opportunity to undertake work experience outside of your timetable.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

There are no formal entry requirements for this course, just a willingness to learn and the ability to embrace challenges.

PROGRESSION

Progression from this course could lead you on to the Career Skills programme or other college courses. Alternatively, you could move into a traineeship.

CAREER SKILLS

Level 1 | Duration: 1 year

 Tiverton | FTT055

Full-time

This is a supportive programme that will provide you with a range of employability related skills.

You will undertake a BTEC qualification which will cover a range of vocational based topics such as crime scene investigation and website design. You will also be given the opportunity to work towards completing the certificate or diploma. This will run alongside taking English and Maths qualifications if you have not achieved a grade 4.

You will be able to access a range of vocational-based tasters in the following areas:

- Hospitality
- Care
- Animal Care
- Sport and Fitness
- Construction

You will also be able to undertake work experience outside of your timetable.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

There are no formal entry requirements for this course, just a willingness to learn and embrace challenges. It is sometimes beneficial to have previously completed the Entry to Career Skills course.

PROGRESSION

Progression from this course can lead you onto the Academic Progression Programme (a Level 2 programme), further courses, traineeships, apprenticeships or employment.

ADVANCED CAREER SKILLS

Level 2 | Duration: 1 year

 Tiverton | FTT272

Full-time

This course is primarily a progression route for learners who have completed the Career Skills course.

It will develop your academic skills as well as your personal skills in a supportive and friendly environment so that you can progress to further Level 2 study, Level 3 or employment.

You will study the following units:

- Level 2 Work Skills Certificate (to develop your skills and prepare you for progression).
- GCSE in Citizenship (focuses on life in the UK, politics, criminal law and international relations).

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You must hold four GCSEs at grade 2 or equivalent (or above), preferably including Maths and English.

PROGRESSION

Upon successful completion of this course, you could progress into employment or onto a Level 3 course.

ESOL SKILLS FOR LIFE (English for Speakers of Other Languages)

Level 1 | Duration: 1 year

 Tiverton | FTT250

Part-time

Improve your confidence to communicate in English at work, in education and in your social life. Meet new friends from all over the world in a relaxed atmosphere and gain a qualification at a level to suit you.

You will learn to study English speaking, listening, reading, writing, pronunciation and grammar through a range of activities including games, role-play, reading comprehension and vocabulary exercises and different styles of writing.

We run this course in a range of different levels to suit your needs and abilities: Pre-entry, Entry 1, Entry 2, Entry 3, Level 1 and Level 2 courses.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS


There are no entry requirements for this course. An initial assessment will determine the correct level of class for you.

PROGRESSION

Completion of this course will open up a wide range of further studies or employment opportunities.

FUNCTIONAL SKILLS ENGLISH

Level 2 | Duration: 10 weeks

 Tiverton | PTT300J (Jan 2023)
PTT301 (Apr 2023)

Part-time

This course is designed for anyone who wants to improve their English skills either for the workplace or for further study.

You will cover a variety of topics designed to help you improve your understanding of different texts and improve your spelling, punctuation and grammar to enable you to write confidently and effectively in a range of situations such as emails, letters and reports. You will also work on communication skills which are a vital transferable skill for the workplace.

You can choose to study your course in-person or online.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS


There are no entry requirements for this course.

PROGRESSION

Level 2 Functional Skills is a requirement in many areas of employment, further education and higher education.

FUNCTIONAL SKILLS MATHEMATICS

Level 2 | Duration: 10 weeks

 Tiverton | PTT319J (Jan 2023)
PTT303 (Apr 2023)

Part-time

This course will help you develop your knowledge and understanding of maths.

You will study the following units:

- Fractions
- Decimals
- Percentages
- Patterns and sequences
- Data analysis
- Measurement
- Probability

You can choose to study your course either in-person or online.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

There are no entry requirements for this course.

PROGRESSION

Functional Skills mathematics Level 2 is a key qualification for employment, further education and higher education.

GCSE ENGLISH

Level 2 | Duration: 1 year

 Tiverton | PTT293

Part-time

A GCSE in English can be your key to future success in work and education.

In the first six weeks we will assess your progress. Based on this assessment, we will recommend a one- or a two-year programme of study.

During the course, you will read and analyse a number of written and spoken, fiction and non-fiction, texts from the 19th, 20th and 21st centuries, including letters, blogs and articles.

You will develop your skills by writing a variety of texts for different audiences and purposes as well as improving your spelling, punctuation and grammar.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

There are no entry requirements for this course.

PROGRESSION

Completion of this course will open up a wide range of further studies or employment opportunities.

GCSE MATHS

Level 2 | Duration: 1 year

 Tiverton | PTT294

Part-time

A GCSE in maths can be your key to future success in work and education.

In the first six weeks we will assess your progress. Based on this assessment, we will recommend a one- or a two-year programme of study.

During the course you will study the following:

- Fractions
- Decimals
- Percentages
- Patterns and sequences
- Data analysis
- Measurement
- Probability
- Algebra

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

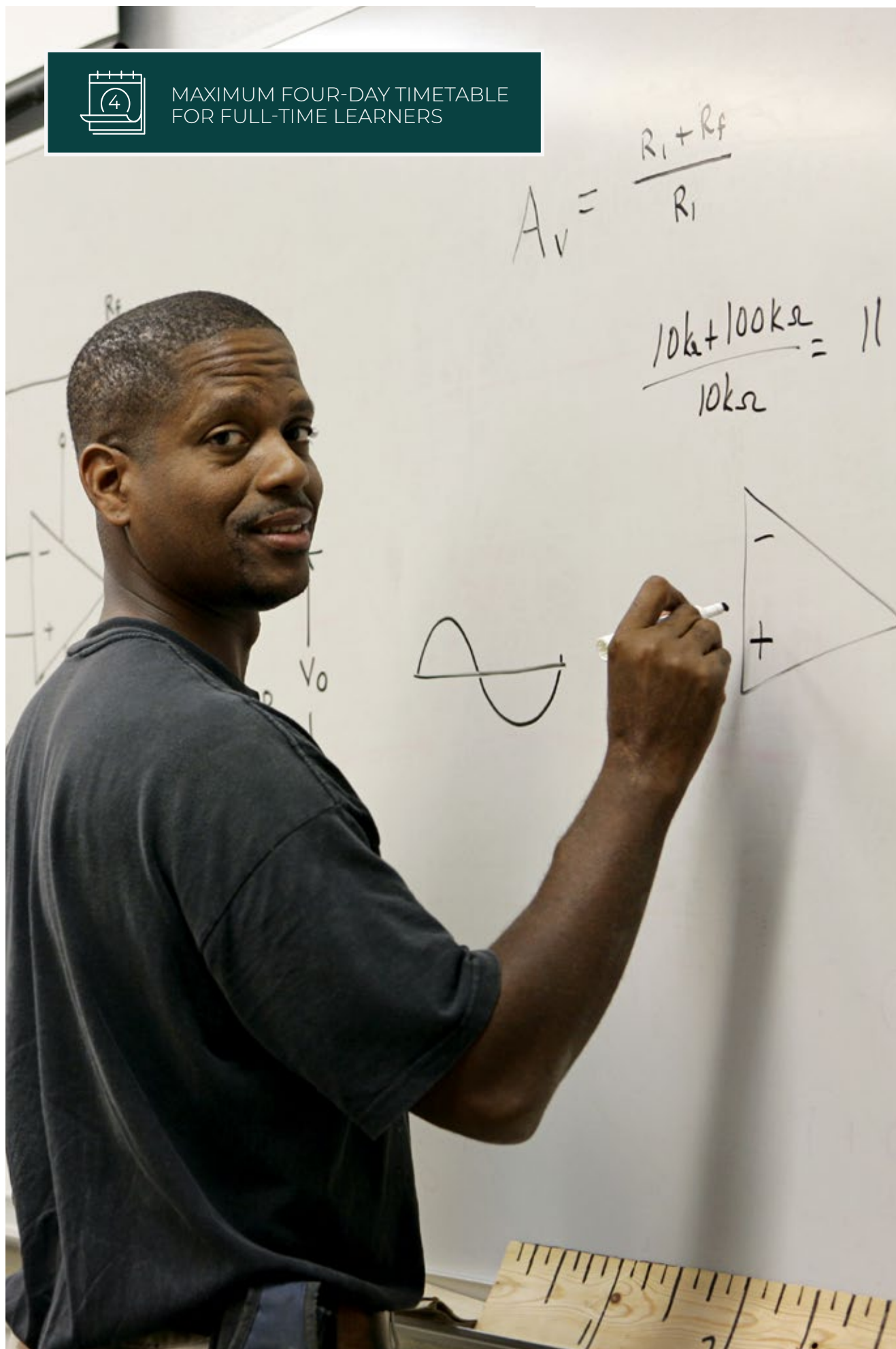

HEALTH, CHILDCARE AND EDUCATION

Level 1 | Duration: 1 year

 Tiverton | FTT294

Full-time

This introductory programme combines classroom theory and practical learning to provide a taster in a range of subject areas. You will learn core knowledge and specific skills that underpins each of these specialisms that will allow you to progress onto a higher level of study within your chosen area.

You will undertake an assortment of study components including core and specialist modules, a tutorial programme, and the opportunity to improve your GCSE Maths and English. The course will also support you in developing your study skills.

You will study the following modules:

- Introduction to working within a health and social care environment
- Sharing learning experiences with children
- Growth and development of young children

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You must hold four GCSEs at grade 2 or equivalent (or above), preferably including Maths and English.

PROGRESSION

Upon successful completion of this course, you can progress onto one of our Transition to T Level courses in Health and Social Care or Childcare and Education.

HEALTH & SOCIAL CARE

Level 2 | Duration: 1 year

 Tiverton | FTT290

Full-time

This Extended Diploma in Health & Social Care is designed to give you a thorough introduction to working in the different health and social care settings including children, vulnerable adults and older adults.

You will be taught the theory needed to understand how to meet the needs of different service users.

You will study the following modules:

HEALTH & SOCIAL CARE

Level 3 | Duration: 2 years

 Tiverton | FTT292

Full-time

The health and social care sector is a vibrant, ever-changing field that requires the most dedicated staff. This National Extended Diploma in Health & Social Care will give you a valuable qualification in supporting the varying needs of people of all ages.

You will study the following modules:

- Human lifespan development
- Working in health and social care
- Meeting individual care and support needs
- Principles of safe practice

ACCESS TO HIGHER EDUCATION:

DIPLOMA IN HEALTH PROFESSIONS

Level 3 | Duration: 1 year

 Tiverton | FTT128L

Higher Education

Access to Higher Education Diplomas enable mature students to gain the skills, knowledge and confidence needed in order to progress on to a degree.

Nursing, Midwifery and Medical Science includes Biology (mandatory), and a choice of two of the following subjects: Chemistry, Psychology and Health Studies.

Within your chosen modules you will study the following:

- Biology: biochemistry, cell biology, physiology, human disease, inheritance.
- Chemistry: bonding and reactions, energetics, kinetics and redox, organic chemistry.
- Psychology: criminology, early social development, stress and wellbeing, atypical psychology.
- Health Studies: perspectives of health, history of health and medicine.

This course is a Level 3 programme which enables you to progress on to a Foundation Degree or full Honours Degree at Petroc, awarded by the University of Plymouth, or to a BA or BSc programme at any UK university.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You will need a grade 5 in GCSE Maths and English. You will also need a grade 4 in Science in order to study Biology and Chemistry.

PROGRESSION

On successful completion of this course, you could apply for a degree in a range of subjects such as human biosciences, mental health, midwifery, occupational therapy or dental hygiene.

ACCESS TO HIGHER EDUCATION:

DIPLOMA IN SCIENCE

Level 3 | Duration: 1 year

 Tiverton | FTT130L

Higher Education

Access to Higher Education Diplomas enable mature students to gain the skills, knowledge and confidence needed in order to progress on to a degree.

This diploma prepares you for in-depth study of scientific disciplines at degree level.

To complete the course, you must choose three subjects from biology, chemistry, mathematics or psychology.

You will study the following topics:

- Biology: biochemistry, cell biology, physiology, human disease and inheritance.
- Chemistry: organic chemistry, chemical bonding and reactions, energetics and kinetics.
- Psychology: stress, wellbeing, early social development and crime.
- Mathematics: calculus, statistics and trigonometry.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Entry requirements vary depending on the modules you decide to take:

Biology - grade 4/5 in biology; or grade 4/5 in science
Chemistry - grade 4/5 in chemistry; or grade 4/5 in science and additional Science
Maths - grade 6

PROGRESSION

On successful completion of this course, you could apply for a science-based degree course or move into a science-based career.

ACCESS TO HIGHER EDUCATION:

DIPLOMA IN HUMANITIES, EDUCATION & SOCIAL WORK

Level 3 | Duration: 1 year

 Tiverton | FTT229L

Higher Education

Access to Higher Education Diplomas enable mature students to gain the skills, knowledge and confidence needed in order to progress on to a degree.

Humanities, Education & Social Work covers an array of fascinating topics relating to literary studies, sociology and psychology.

You will study the following topics:

- Literary Studies: poetry, play writing, novels, composition.
- Sociology: class, gender and ethnicity inequalities; and differences in health and education.
- Psychology: stress and wellbeing, early social development, crime.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You will be required to have gained GCSE grades at 5 or above in English and maths, or equivalent.

PROGRESSION

On successful completion of this course you could apply for a degree such as teaching, anthropology, journalism, history, sociology, social work or criminology.

HEALTH & SOCIAL CARE APPRENTICESHIP

We offer a **Healthcare Assistant Practitioner (Level 5)** apprenticeship at Petroc Tiverton.

Apprenticeships blend classroom learning with on-the-job training, meaning you can earn while you learn. You will usually spend four days in the workplace as a paid employee, with one day in the classroom where you will reinforce and further develop your skills and workplace learnings.

During your apprenticeship, you will be expected to undertake a range of predefined knowledge, skills and behaviours which will relate to your chosen health and social care programme.

An apprenticeship lasts between one and two years and can start at various points in the year.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Each apprenticeship has its own specific entry requirements; you can find out more on our website.

PROGRESSION

An apprenticeship is a great pathway to a rewarding and successful career, or can be a stepping stone to a higher-level programme.

PREPARATION FOR ADULTHOOD

Entry Level | Duration: 1 year

📍 Tiverton | FTT067

Full-time

This course helps learners achieve their potential in life and work. It covers the four outcomes that young people with disabilities have said are important to them: employment, independent living, community inclusion and good health.

You can choose from two pathways:

- **Pathway A:** Independent Living and Community Inclusion develops the personal skills needed for living with increasing independence and getting ready for employment.
- **Pathway B:** Further Education and Employment supports students into gaining more qualifications and getting a job, as well as developing skills for independent living and community involvement. Students develop employability skills through vocational options such as bike maintenance, woodwork, catering, business administration, IT, art and conservation.

The course is enriched by a variety of activities, workshops, educational visits and a residential trip.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

There are no formal entry requirements for this course.

PROGRESSION

On completion of this course, you can progress towards further education, employment, independent living and participation in the community.

PROJECT LIFE EMPLOYMENT

Entry Level | Duration: 1 year

📍 Tiverton | FTT066

Full-time

This course is suitable for anyone aged 17+ with an EHCP. It is designed to help students to recognise and develop skills to achieve their potential with life and work.

You will study the following units:

- Exploring the world of work: Investigating job roles, career pathways and volunteering
- Creating personal skills profile: Exploring skills, strengths and vocational profiling
- Learning how to apply for a job, preparing for and attending a job interview
- Individualised work placement in the community
- Community team project: Planning and carrying out a group project
- Enterprise activities: Developing and managing an enterprise project
- Vocational element: Options include catering, hospitality, and woodwork
- IT, English and maths skills are embedded throughout

Partnerships with a variety of local employers will provide opportunities to experience a work placement.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

There are no formal entry requirements for this course.

PROGRESSION

Successful completion of this course may provide you with the opportunity to progress to a supported internship course, an apprenticeship or a higher level of study in a vocational area.

PETROC INDEPENDENCE ACADEMY (MONDAY)

Entry Level | Duration: 1 year

📍 Tiverton | PTT255

Part-time

This self-funded course is available to students with an identified learning disability who have completed formal education. Students can develop skills by working as part of a team preparing, cooking and running our Exe café.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

There are no formal entry requirements for this course.

PROGRESSION

Upon completion of this course, you will be able to gain active community involvement or a Level 1 qualification.

PETROC INDEPENDENCE ACADEMY (WEDNESDAY)

Entry Level | Duration: 1 year

 Tiverton | PTT254

Part-time

This self-funded course is available to students with an identified learning disability who have completed formal education. Students can develop skills by working as part of a team preparing, cooking and running our Exe café.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

There are no formal entry requirements for this course.

PROGRESSION

Upon completion of this course, you will be able to gain active community involvement or a Level 1 qualification.

PROJECT SEARCH (EXETER)

Level 1 | Duration: 1 year

 Tiverton | FTT305

Full-time

Project SEARCH is a supported internship for people who want to get a job. It has been specifically created for students with an EHCP who have a learning disability or Autistic Spectrum Condition.

You will work solely at Royal Devon & Exeter Hospital to gain new employability skills with the ultimate goal of getting paid employment when you leave the project. The course runs at the hospital for five days a week and is supported by two full-time Project SEARCH staff as well as onsite mentors.

At the start of the course, you will undertake a three-week settling in period, where you will receive all the training necessary to be safe and professional within the hospital grounds. You will then undertake three 10-week placements in the hospital, where you will be taking on a real role in the hospital.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

There are no formal entry requirements for this course.

PROGRESSION

Successful completion of this course may provide you with the opportunity to progress to a supported internship course, an apprenticeship or a higher level of study in a vocational area.

SUPPORTING YOU & YOUR LEARNING

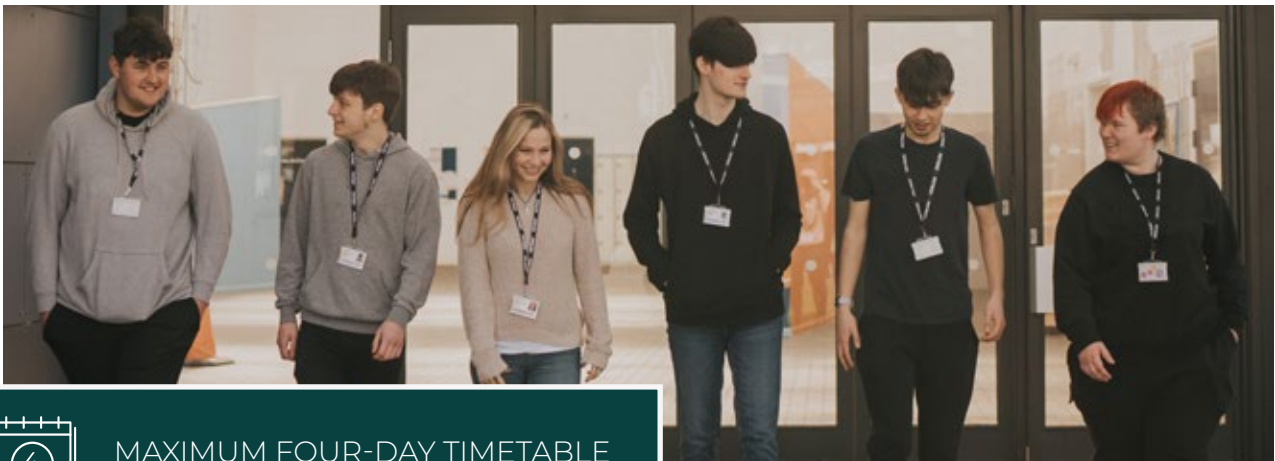

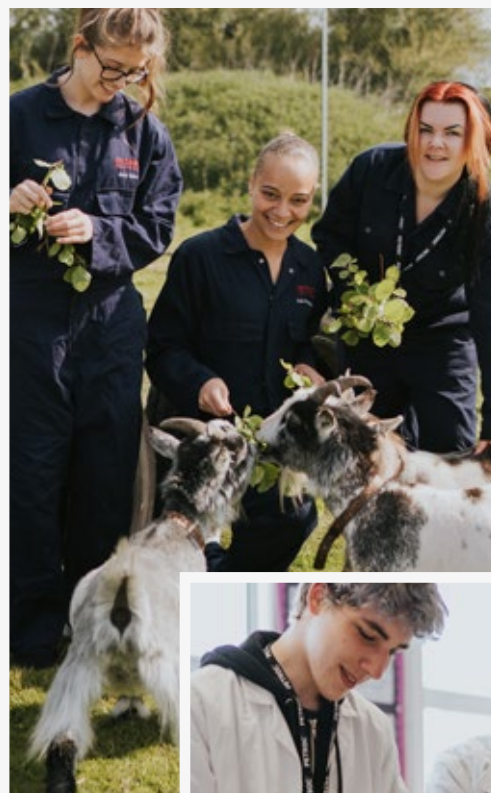

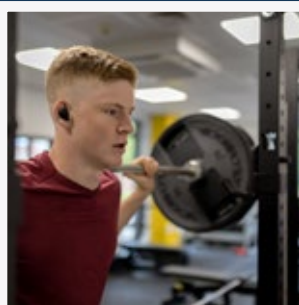
