WHAT HAPPENS AFTER YOU APPLY?

Interview

After we confirm receipt of your application, we'll send you an email inviting you to an interview (interviews may not be needed in some cases, in which case an offer will be made without one and based on your predicted grades). During your interview, we'll ask a bit more about you and your learning needs and give you the opportunity to ask any questions you may have about your course and life at Petroc.

Following a successful interview, you will receive an offer of a place at Petroc via email; it will specify any offer conditions as discussed at your interview, such as required grades.



If you are not offered a place on your first choice of course, we will ensure that someone contacts you to talk through your options. You'll either be offered a place on another relevant course or we'll give you information to take away to help you consider your options.

Once you've accepted an offer, we'll send you regular updates and reminders so that you're fully prepared for starting college - make sure you keep an eye out for our emails! Please make sure you log in to myPetroc as it contains useful information for the start of term and will enable you to upload relevant information when required such as bus passes, bursary applications and GCSE results.

JANUARY FOCUS: T LEVELS AT PETROC

T Levels are a gold standard in vocational education training. They are a Level 3, two-year qualification that combines classroom theory, practical learning and a minimum 315-hour industry placement with an employer to help you develop your industry-specific skills.

When you study a T Level, you'll spend 80% of your time in the classroom or in practical workshops and 20% of your time on an industry placement.

Your industry placement will take place within a local business and will last a minimum of 315 hours (approximately 45 days). It can be undertaken as a block of time (over college holidays for example), or as individual days.
